Principal's Corner

“We must pray without tiring...”

Today we celebrate the feast of one of my favorite saints, St. Frances Xavier Cabrini. Frances was born in Lombardy, Italy in 1850, one of thirteen children. At age eighteen, she desired to become a religious sister but was turned down because of her poor health. A priest friend asked her to teach in a girls' school and she stayed for six years. At the request of her Bishop, she founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart to care for poor children in schools and hospitals. All of her life Frances had wanted to be a missionary to China, but instead Pope Leo XIII urged her to go to the United States in 1889 to work among the Italian immigrants. She and her sisters worked in cities such as New York and Chicago, founding hospitals and starting schools and orphanages. Frances worked tirelessly to help people in need until her death on December 22, 1917 in Chicago.

Today, St. Frances Cabrini's work is continued by the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart in England, France, Spain, the United States and South and Central America. They bring hope to others following her example by caring for those who are homeless, sick, elderly and poor. In 1946, Frances Xavier Cabrini became the first American citizen to be canonized as saint by Pope Pius XII.

As the holidays of Thanksgiving and Christmas quickly approach, I pray that our hearts may be open to the needs of others. May we follow the example of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini as we, too, involve ourselves in activities of sharing our time, talent and treasures with those in need.
