# Principal's Corner

## Putting Words Into Action

In celebration of St. Teresa of Calcutta, I purchased a booklet of reflections for each of the teachers to use in their classrooms. Each day features a quote from St. Teresa, along with a reflection of hers or someone who worked closely with her. The one I selected today, “Let every action of mine be something beautiful for God,” couldn’t be better timed as I jump into this new school year and face the excitement and challenges that come with it.

I’m sure many of you can relate as you juggle a new schedule, all the extra-curriculars, and other fall commitments that leave many of us exhausted by the end of the day. When “in the trenches” as I often refer to it, I find that it’s so easy to forget my mission. However, if I pause just for a moment and remind myself that I am here to do God’s work, the ferocity of my mood subsides and is quickly replaced with a calm that I know can only come from the Holy Spirit. Granted, it’s taken a few years and a lot of prayer to find the tools to take control of my thinking, and admittedly there are moments when I still allow my bullheadedness (as my dad lovingly called my stubbornness) to rise to the surface.
